### Recipe of the Month: Crock Pot Zuppa Toscana

This crock pot zuppa toscana soup is an Olive Garden copycat recipe that makes it easy to bring the taste of Italy home. A simple dinner for busy weekdays!

#### Ingredients:

- 1 lb ground hot Italian sausage 1 tbsp <u>garlic</u> minced 1 yellow onion chopped 4 russet potatoes diced 1 pinch <u>salt</u> to taste 1 pinch <u>black pepper</u> to taste 4 cup <u>chicken broth</u> (32 oz) water (see recipe instructions) 3/4 cup heavy whipping cream 1 bunch kale stems removed and torn into bite-sized pieces 1/4 cup shredded parmesan cheese (for topping)
- 1. In a <u>large skillet</u> over medium-high heat, brown and crumble hot Italian sausage, about 5-8 minutes. Add onion and garlic and cook for an additional 2-3 minutes or until some of the onion begins to turn translucent (no need to cook onion completely at this point). Drain grease from skillet.
- 2. In a <u>6 quart crock pot</u> (or bigger), add cooked sausage & veggies plus the diced potato. Season with salt and pepper, to taste. Pour chicken broth on top. There should be enough broth to cover the tops of the potatoes; if there isn't, add up to 2 cups water so potatoes are covered.
- 3. Gently stir ingredients, cover crock pot, and cook on LOW for 5-6 hours or on HIGH for 3-4 hours.
- 4. Remove lid from crock pot and add kale and heavy whipping cream, then stir to combine.
- 5. Cover crock pot and cook on HIGH for another 30 minutes.

Serve zuppa toscana immediately with shredded parmesan cheese as garnish.

Riley Hospital greatly appreciates fundraising efforts and surprised the Club at its party. One way they show that appreciation is by commissioning a little red wagon bearing the name of the group that donated to Riley. This was the case at the celebration in Plymouth. Amber Miller, Associations Coordinator from Riley Hospital, surprised the Club membership by showing off the wagon that will bear the Chapter's name on its license plate. It is in service in the hospital now.

For weeks, we kept the final total a secret. Then the moment finally came to announce the final tally, and a group of Riley kids each held cards that contained one number of the final amount. Strung together, the numbers revealed a grand total of \$33,333.33.

The banquet on Dec. 8 in Plymouth was about celebrating the amazing partnership between a group of red tractor owners and a non-profit hospital that serves as a last resort for children in need of medical care. One of the speakers declared that healing, "was God's work, but those people (at Riley's) are amazing." Mike Graber, whose daughter was a Riley's patient, talked about "the angels at the hospital and the angels in this club."

The IH Collectors Chapter 33 again wants to thank everyone who helped make the 'Filling a Wagon for Riley' campaign a huge success! The phrase "great things don't happen by accident" was the mantra for the year-long campaign.
